Dear Parishioners and Friends

The Irish Scripture scholar, Fr Kieran O'Mahoney, whose background notes to the Sunday Scripture readings I find very helpful, wrote the following as a background to the feast of Christ the King.

It is often said we live in changing times and of course we do. A hundred years ago, things were even more dramatic. As a result of WWI, great empires had crashed: the Romanov, Ottoman, Hohenzollern and Habsburg empires all disintegrated. The Bolsheviks had taken power in Russia while western Europe saw the rise of nationalism in the form of fascism and increasing secularisation triggered by the tragedy of the war. Inflation such as we could never imagine took hold in Germany. There was more to come: the great crash of 1929 and the grim rise of antisemitism and all that followed. Such was the broad context for the new feast of Christ the King, established by Pope Pius XI in 1925, not quite a hundred years ago.

The gesture was timely and can still speak to us today. Pius XI wanted to remind people that in the midst of destruction, tragedy, radical instability and despair, there is an utterly stable point of reference and a very different set of values to guide us: the person of Jesus and the visionary values of the Sermon on the Mount. In the words of Pius XI: The faithful, moreover, by meditating upon these truths, will gain much strength and courage, enabling them to form their lives after the true Christian ideal.

May I also take this opportunity to remind you that next Sunday, the first Sunday of Advent, we shall start using the new Lectionary readings. For decades, the Scripture readings we have heard in church, have been taken from the New Jerusalem Bible translation; and for decades there has been controversy about how true this translation is to the original Hebrew and Greek. After much debate the bishops of England and Wales have adopted the 'Catholic Edition of the English Standard Version'. It is said to be a vibrant, more lively translation, more true to the original texts. Let's have an open mind to receiving the Word of God in this new version!

St Anne's Church Roof Update

Thank-you to everyone for your ongoing support for the Church Roof Appeal...through regular Direct Debit Donations or from the events that groups are kindly running to support us. I am also pleased to say that we are receiving Gift Aid payments as a result of the donations.

We are now in a position to start the Tower restoration, the most complex and therefore expensive phase that we have taken on. At this point, the Roof Fund does not have all the funds needed, so I am grateful to the Parish who have extended a 'loan' to enable the work to start.

We will completely replace the roof of the Tower and its guttering. In addition, we will replace the louvres on the sides of the tower and remedy other stonework problems in this area. Much of the work will be undertaken at height and following a bat survey we must also complete it during Bat hibernation season.

At the start of January, you will start to see scaffolding being erected, with the whole project targeted to be completed around Easter 2025.

There may be some restrictions on Church access routes and services in this time, which we will communicate in the Bulletin.

I will issue a more detailed Newsletter early in January to keep you updated on the progress of the penultimate stage of our project. Once again this would not be possible without your very generous and ongoing support
