#### **Dear Parishioners and Friends**

If I don't mention it here the forthcoming Holy Year in the Catholic Church might go unnoticed! 'Holy' years or 'Jubilee' years go back to biblical times. In the Hebrew Bible, a Year of Jubilee, or 'yovel', is a year that occurs every 50 years and is marked by a period of rest, debt forgiveness, and the freeing of enslaved people. The yovel is a musical instrument which was played to announce the beginning a year of jubilee, a time to re-establish relationships with God, one another, and creation. It's also a time for economic, cultural, environmental, and communal reset. The Catholic Church holds jubilee years every 25 years for similar reasons. The coming Jubilee Year of 2025 will be the second under the pontificate of Pope Francis: the extraordinary Jubilee, the Year of Mercy, was celebrated in 2016. This time, Pope Francis invites the faithful to live the holy year as "Pilgrims in Hope" which is the motto of the jubilee of 2025. The jubilee logo, designed by Italian artist Giacomo Travisani, shows four stylized figures, representing all of humanity coming from the four corners of the earth. They embrace each other to indicate the solidarity and fraternity which should unite all peoples. The rough waves under the figures symbolize the fact that life's pilgrimage does not always go smoothly in calm waters. The anchor is a symbol of hope. The dynamic cross of Christ bends down towards humanity, not leaving us all alone, but stretching out to us to offer the certainty of its presence and the security of hope.



Pope Francis will open the 'Holy' Door in the Vatican on Christmas Eve, while here in the archdiocese Archbishop Malcolm will begin the Holy Year in this archdiocese on Sunday 29 December by opening the Holy Door in the Metropolitan Cathedral. As 'Pilgrims of Hope' there is much to exploit over the coming year in this engaging theme.

Prescot Road entrance to church grounds (NO PEDESTRIAN ACCESS MONDAY TO FRIDAY)

Church rear car park (NO PARKING ON WEEKDAYS drop off/pickup only AT SCHOOL START AND FINISH TIMES)

Church rear car park parking only for Saturday Vigil Mass and Sunday Mass Footways around the church (closed)

Rear sacristy door (limited access)

Grave yard to left of rear turning circle (limited access during material deliveries)

Graveyard to right of rear turning and side of church (limited access during the hours of 8:00 and 17:00)

We would really appreciate if all staff, parents, pupils and visitors could make the effort to avoid using the car parking areas to reduce the chance of bottle necks and leave space for those who really need to use the car park and the contractors to complete the work without hindrance.

Could you also please keep clear of the area around the Tower scaffolding once erected.

Please observe the yellow and red NO parking areas in the car park and DO NOT PARK in front of the entrance and emergency exit doors and walkways at anytime. If you have any queries please contact the parish office in the first instance giving your full details. Many Thanks
